Course Content:

Expanding further on topics and practices covered on the BA course (detailed below), each student was responsible for writing, pitching, casting, funding, filming, editing and screening their own short film (of up to 15 minutes). I produced and directed a sit-com set in a hospital waiting room, named 'Night Nurse' – which can be found on my site. We also worked with our colleagues as crew members on their shoots, giving me an opportunity to explore roles I had not previously performed – like steadycam operating and focus-pulling. We compiled professional pre-production, production and post-production packs: providing all formal documentation needed for every stage of the creative process. There were several other written modules one in which we were required to write treatments for, and pre-produce, a theoretical feature project (something I intend to re-visit). I was also required to create two 'video essays' – one on the potential impact of 'Brexit' on the UK Film Industry, and one on film's evolution on the 'God Man'. Both are available on my site. We had an 'Inter-disciplinary' module in which we worked with students from other MA courses to design and build art exhibits for a viewing by creative professionals. We explored software that was new to me (including 'Da Vinci' and 'Lightroom') and we had sessions on directing, editing and sound design (the latter delivered by Hollywood Sound Designer Val Kuklowsky). I thoroughly enjoyed this course and plan to expand further into a doctorate at some point in the future. I met many people that I would like to work with again.

In written work we covered the business of the film industry and how it operates, exploring policies, practices and legalities. We also studied the works of established and influential directors and the histories and developments of key genres. We compiled production packs supporting our practical projects, created work-experience based industry reports and wrote dissertations reflecting our knowledge and awareness of film production concepts and techniques.

In practical work each student project-managed and produced a short independent film of their own and contributed as a member of the creative team on four colleague productions. Giving us ample experience of working as part of a team. At this Skillset Media Academy we received training from industry professionals on the equipment and software used in today's film and TV industries, including:
